#### Care Share Health Alliance

- A health equity focused, NC-based non-profit that supports Community-Based Organizations (CBOs) which address the Social Determinants of Health
- A major focus of our work is supporting community partners and enrollment assisters during Medicaid Expansion implementation

# NC Community Health Center Association (NCCHCA)

- Formed in 1978 to support and advocate on behalf of community health centers (CHCs) and their patients.
- NCCHCA currently supports 43 member CHCs that collectively operate 550 sites in 88 counties.
- CHCs provide integrated medical, dental, pharmacy, behavioral health, and enabling services (e.g., health insurance enrollment) to patients regardless of insurance status, immigration status, or ability to pay.





## NC Community Health Center Association (NCCHCA)

- CHCs in NC served 696,000 patients in 2022
- Insurance breakdown (2022, prior to expansion)
  - 36% Uninsured
  - o 23% Medicaid
  - 14% Medicare
  - 27% Third-party insurance

- CHCs are an important site for identifying people who are newly eligible for Medicaid.
- These patients can continue to seek care at their local CHC and will now have peace of mind that they are covered in the event of a serious or chronic health issue.





# NC Community Health Center Association (NCCHCA)

- In early 2024, NCCHCA hired eight (8) Regional Support Specialists (RSSs) to support CHCs with Medicaid expansion outreach and enrollment efforts.
- RSSs are Certified Application Counselors (CACs) and are trained to help individuals apply for and connect to health coverage.

#### NC Navigator Consortium

- Led by Legal Aid of NC, the NC Navigator Consortium is a collection of 11 health & community nonprofits
- Work in collaboration to maximize Healthcare.gov
   Marketplace and Medicaid education/enrollment
- Coordinate outreach/enrollment/education events
- Work with local & statewide partners to get the word out
- Over 150 active Navigators at 183 locations statewide in the last year

#### Accomplishments since 2013:

- Touched over 7 million North Carolinians with information about the ACA
- Direct 1:1 conversations with ~750,000 North
   Carolinians
- Directly enrolled/re-enrolled over 120,000

- Informed policy leaders, including Governor Roy Cooper, US Congresspeople, US HHS Secretary Becerra



# Medicaid Expansion Introduction and Eligibility Overview





#### What is Medicaid?

- Medicaid through Expansion is comprehensive health coverage. It pays for doctor visits, yearly check-ups, emergency care, mental health and more – at little or no cost to beneficiaries (highest copay is \$4).
- Medicaid is financed jointly by the federal government and states, and is administered by the states (NC DHHS in North Carolina)






#### The Affordable Care Act (ACA)

- In addition to creating the Federally-Facilitated
  Marketplace (Healthcare.gov), a key provision of the ACA was
  the requirement that states expand Medicaid eligibility to
  people with incomes up to 138 percent of the federal
  poverty level.
- In 2012, the U.S. Supreme Court ruled that this requirement was unconstitutional, allowing states to choose whether to adopt the reform. Twenty-six states including the District of Columbia expanded Medicaid initially, and since then, 15 other states have followed suit, including North Carolina. As of April 2024, 10 states have not expanded eligibility.









#### Medicaid/ Healthcare.gov Coverage *Prior to* Expansion in NC










#### Medicaid/ Healthcare.gov Coverage Now





NC Medicaid income requirements have been expanded to include adults ages 19-64 earning up to 138 percent of the Federal Poverty Line.

 Previously, the income limits were much lower, with no option for childless adults without disabilities.







### Medicaid Expansion Eligibility Requirements:

- Live in North Carolina
- Ages 19 through 64 years old
- A citizen (some non-US citizens can also get health care coverage through Medicaid).
- And household income falls within the following chart:

Family Size	Monthly Income Limit, Before Taxes	Annual Income Limit, Before Taxes
Single adult	\$1,732 or less	\$20,782 or less
2	\$2,392 or less	\$28,207 or less
3	\$2,969 or less	\$35,631 or less
4	\$3,588 or less	\$43,065 or less
Each additional person	Add \$618/month	Add \$7,424/year






#### Update: DACA status eligibility

- Effective November 1, 2024, Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) holders will be eligible to enroll in Healthcare.gov coverage, assuming they meet other eligibility criteria
- DACA is not considered a Qualified Immigration status for Medicaid, so <u>DACA holders are still not eligible for</u> <u>Medicaid through expansion</u>
- DACA holders whose income is within the Medicaid Expansion eligibility limits (0-138% FPL) can qualify for financial assistance when enrolling in coverage on Healthcare.gov.

## Important Reminders about Medicaid Expansion

- Medicaid is for low-income individuals, while Medicare is typically for individuals age 65+
- The "asset test" is not a part of the Expansion eligibility requirements
- A history of incarceration cannot disqualify someone from receiving Medicaid
- Previous Medicaid denial or recent termination does not necessarily disqualify someone from Medicaid Expansion







#### Reminder: Medicaid Copays

Beneficiaries should not be denied services due to an inability to pay at the time of service.

- Under 42 C.F.R. 447.52(e)(2) providers are generally prohibited from denying "services to an eligible individual on account of the individual's inability to pay the cost sharing."
- Guidance found in <u>Clinical Coverage</u>
   <u>Policy</u> and <u>State Plan Amendment</u>


#### NC Medicaid Ombudsman



# Strategies to Connect Clients/Patients to Medicaid





#### **Connect Patients to Information**

- Display <u>flyers</u> in exam rooms, waiting areas, bathrooms, etc.
- Have patient-facing staff become familiar with basic Medicaid expansion eligibility criteria
- Prioritize reaching uninsured patients
  - Run a list of uninsured patients and reach out to them
  - Identify uninsured patients when they come in for appointment





#### Connect Patients to Assistance

- Connect patients with an enrollment
   assister (even if you're not sure the patient
   qualifies for Medicaid)
  - Provide phone number and website for the Connector
  - Help patient schedule an appointment on the Connector
- Set-up kiosk for patients to <u>apply online for</u> Medicaid







## Provide Enhanced Support

#### Patient-facing staff can train to become:

- Medicaid Ambassador to answer questions about Medicaid expansion.
- Navigator or Certified Application Counselor (CAC) to help people apply for Medicaid and Marketplace coverage.





## Provide Enhanced Support

#### **Navigator**

 Become a volunteer Navigator by completing this form and selecting the "Enrollment Assister Interest" box.

## **Certified Application Counselor** (CAC)

- Organization becomes a <u>Certified Application</u> <u>Counselor Designated</u> <u>Organization (CDO)</u>
- Staff of CDOs can train to become a CAC
- CDO application







## **Community Partnerships**

- Connect with community partners that:
  - Serve potentially eligible people
  - oProvide education about Medicaid
  - oAssist with the Medicaid applications
- Develop/foster relationship with county DSS office
  - Could a DSS caseworker be present at your organization one day/week to assist patients and answer their questions?

# Addressing Suspected Fraudulent Marketplace Enrollments







## Background

Over the past 1.5 years, there has been an increased frequency in suspected fraudulent enrollments by agents and brokers in Healthcare.gov plans.

CMS received 90,000 complaints about unauthorized enrollments in the first quarter of 2024. (Source: KFF News)

 Certain vulnerable populations are being targeted (ex: people for whom English is not their first language, unhoused populations)





## Background

#### What does this look like?

- Applications are being submitted either without the individual's knowledge or consent OR individuals are being intentionally misled and not given information about the implications of the enrollment
- A beneficiary might only realize that they are enrolled in both Marketplace and Medicaid coverage when they attempt to use their Medicaid coverage







### **Implications**

## Clients enrolled in both Marketplace and full Medicaid coverage can experience several problems:

- Medicaid is the payor of last resort and won't cover medical costs until the client's Marketplace plan has been charged.
- Tax penalties- if someone is double-covered for an extended period and the fraud isn't appropriately reported, they might have to re-pay the Marketplace subsidy they received.





### Steps to Take

If a patient is told they are enrolled in a Marketplace plan that they weren't aware of...

- Refer them to an enrollment assister ASAP
- Enrollment Assisters can fill out a Complex
   Case Form to report the fraud and
   retroactively cancel the enrollment, and
   help connect them to the NC Department of
   Insurance if needed
